

month of October they received an envelope directed to him covering a commission appointing him the said James Millan Sheriff which was by him placed in his office in a conspicuous place & there kept for two months from the date of the said commission that some time in December two months having elapsed from the date of the said comm<sup>n</sup> he certified to the executive the failure of said James Millan to give bonds and security according to law, that some time in the same month December he the said Samuel Kello received another envelope directed to him covering a comm<sup>n</sup> appointing Samuel Blunt to be Sheriff of this county which said commission was dated on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of Decr 1811 that that comm<sup>n</sup> also was kept in the office in a conspicuous place until the 17<sup>th</sup> of February 1812 when James Rochelle the deputy of the said Samuel informed him the said Samuel that Samuel Blunt had applied for his comm<sup>n</sup> and the said Samuel directed the said James to deliver the said comm<sup>n</sup> appointing the said Samuel Blunt to be Sheriff to him the said Samuel that on the 24<sup>th</sup> of the month of February 1812 that said

Samuel Kello certified the failure of said Samuel Blunt to the court that he <sup>had</sup> been appointed by the executive for the state of New York on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 1811 to be Sheriff of this county & that he had been refused the said appointment by the court to give bonds of security according to law.

After hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the said having made no nomination of person to the executive for the office of Sheriff and upon mature deliberation thereon had an opinion that the commission appointing James Millan to be Sheriff of this county <sup>this day presented by him to the exec</sup> had illegally & improperly issued and is therefore void & whereupon the court doth refuse to admit the said James Millan to give bond.
