 discharged from her imprisonment which
 is accordingly done

The Court being thus constituted the prisoner was
 set to the bar, in custody of the Sheriff & charged &
 answered with having feloniously prepared & certain
 medicines or potions with an intent of poisoning the
 said Bailey & Joshua Fort assigned his counsel for the
 prisoner and the prisoner pleaded not guilty & for her
 trial put herself upon God & the Court and 2
 witnesses appeared, to wit, a negro woman Ann
 the property of William Bailey, who being
