

James O. Preston Governor or Chief magistrate of this Commonwealth
the said Thos. L. Jones in the Sum of one thousand dollars, and
the said James D. Mapenburg and Math. Newman, each in the
Sum of five hundred dollars, of their respective lands and
Tenements goods and Chattels, to be devised, and to the said Governor
and his Successors, for the use of the Commonwealth rendered, yet
upon this Condition that if the said Thomas L. Jones, shall personally
make his appearance, before the Judge of our Superior Court of
Suffolk County on the first day of September next, at 12 O'clock of that
day at the Court house, then and there to abide and perform the
Judgment of that Court, and shall not depart thence, without the
leave of the Court, then this recognizance to be void else to remain
in full force and effect.

But it remembered, that James D. Mapenburg, Walter
Cornwall and Henry Insley, here in Court acknowledged themselves
to be indebted unto his excellency James O. Preston Esqr. Governor or
Chief magistrate of this Commonwealth, and his Successors in office
each in the Sum of Three hundred thirty three and a third dollars
of their respective lands and Tenements goods, ^{and Chattels} to be devised, to the said
Governor, for the use of the Commonwealth rendered yet upon
this Condition that if they and each of them shall personally make
their appearance, before the Judge of our Superior Court of Suffolk County
at the Court house by 12 O'clock on the first day of September next
then and there to give such testimony, as ^{they} each of them know on
behalf of the Commonwealth, against Thomas L. Jones, touching the murder
of Jeffery a negro man State, and shall not depart thence, without
the Consent of the Court, then this recognizance to be void else to remain
in full force and effect.
