

At a court of Oyer and Terminus Summons and bills for the county of Southampton on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of April 1820 for the trial of Sam a negro man slave the property of Robert Pickford and charged with having feloniously & Burglariously broken and entered the smelt house of Nathan Pooley of this county on the night of the 6<sup>th</sup> of this present month April and then & there feloniously steal take & carry away fifteen pounds of Bacon and thirty pounds of Bacon and one table cloth.

The court being thus constituted, the prisoner was sent to the bar by the Sheriff of this county into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the felony aforesaid and being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty and upon oaths several were sworn and examined on behalf of the command touching the premises with Nathan Pooley & of Fagan & Dick negro slaves and the prisoner being fully heard by counsel the court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty and thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alledged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged

Ordered that Collin Hitchcock, Matthew Balunt & James Rockville or any two of them examine state and settle the account of Richd<sup>t</sup>. P. Clements late Sheriff of Gt. ton with the county for the year 1819 and an additional account for the year 1818 and report it.

Henry Briggs and Ch<sup>t</sup>. Briggs qualified as deputies of George Henry Sheriff of this county acc<sup>r</sup> to law

Ordered that John Monmack, Esq<sup>r</sup> of James B. Monmack esq<sup>r</sup> be summoned to the next court to show cause if any he can why an attachment on not be issued against him for failing to render an acct<sup>r</sup> of his acct<sup>r</sup> on said estate when duly notified in pursuance of an order of the court for that purpose
