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At a court held for the county of Southampton on the 19th day of August 1840 In pursuance of an act of assembly entitled an act to explain and amend an act passed the 12th day of February 1814 -

Present: Jeremiah Cobb & James Glynnick Esqrs.
 Respects to Elizabeth Turner - Upon a warrant to recover the possession of a certain tract or parcel of land containing 68 acres of land with the appurtenances lying and being in the county of Southampton - It appearing that the said warrant hath been duly executed according to the provision of the above recited act of assembly, and that Jeremiah Cobb and James Glynnick Esqrs. Justices of the peace for the county aforesaid have been duly notified as required by the said act, and also that eighteen good and lawfull men freeholders have been summoned as required by the said act. It is ordered that a Jury of Twelve be selected by lot from the said freeholders - whereupon came a Jury selected by lot to wit: John Wick, Mr. Joyner, Benwell Beale, Muriel Edwards, William Beale, David Doyal, John Elcor, Henry B. Vaughan, James Powell, Patrick Cole, Howell Brewer, & Thomas Elorby who being charged in the said act of assembly require, returned in the verdict in the words following to wit: "We the Jury find that the defendant is at the time of the exhibition of the complaint filed in this cause, holds possession of the tenement therein mentioned against the consent of the plaintiff that the said defendant hath so held possession thereof against the consent of the plaintiff within three years next before the exhibition of said complaint; and that the Plaintiff hath the right of possession in the tenement aforesaid - Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant possession of the tenement aforesaid and his costs by him about in this behalf expended and a writ of habere facias possessionem is awarded returnable here." *Justices*

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
