Bob a negro man slave the property of Mary Brichlow of this county was this day set to the bar by the Sheriff of this county into whose custody he was heretofore committed & charged with feloniously & Burglariously breaking open & entering the store house of David Wallace merchant in the Town of Jerusalem (a part of which was occupied as a dwelling house on the 23rd day of April last past & then & there did feloniously & Burglariously steal take & carry away Broadcloth, cambricks, checks, Calicoes, Black Silk Handkerchiefs & Two Trunks containing a large ^{amount} in bank notes two bags containing Silver money & two half eagles & ^{Bank} ~~hand~~ notes & accounts, two guns & one trunk containing sundry wearing apparel, all of which amounts to about Six thousand dollars in value - and being thereof arraigned and upon his arraignment pleaded not guilty and for his Trial put himself upon god and this court (The court of Oyer & Terminer Commanded for his Trial not having met) and thereupon given witness were sworn & examined on behalf the commonwealth Touching the premises to wit David Wallace and Sam a negro man slave the property of Robert Ricks of this county - The court after hearing the testimony of all the circumstances of the case (and the prisoner being fully heard by counsel) are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty and thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is & nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged from further prosecution in this behalf
