at a com<sup>t</sup> summons and held for the county of Southampton on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of December 1818 for the examination of Harrod Doles who stands charged with stealing, taking and carrying away five sheep the property of David J. Boykin of the value of ten dollars from the possession of the said David J. Boykin on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of June last past

William Pickle, and John Vaughan Esq<sup>r</sup>. Just.

The court being thus constituted the prisoner was set to the bar by the Sheriff of this county into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the felony aforesaid, and thereupon oaths witnesses were sworn & examined on behalf of the com<sup>t</sup>. Touching the premises, to wit David J. Boykin, and the prisoner being fully heard by com<sup>t</sup> - The court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner ought to be tried for said offence at the next Superior court to be helden for this county -

Be it remembered that David J. Boykin, here in com<sup>t</sup> acknowledges himself indebted unto his Excellency Thomas de Randolph Esq<sup>r</sup>. Gov<sup>r</sup> of this com<sup>t</sup> and his successor in office for the time being in the sum of \$333:33/3 cents to be levied of his proper goods chattels lands and tenements and to the said Governor for the use of the com<sup>t</sup> rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said David J. Boykin shall personally appear before the Judge of our superior court of St. Law cont<sup>y</sup> at the comthouse of this county on the first day of the next term of said Superior court by 10 O'clock of that day then & there to give such testimony as he knows on behalf of the com<sup>t</sup> against Harrod Doles & shall not repeat thence without leave of the court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force & value -

Be it remembered that Harrod Doles with wife Bailey & Patrick Doles here in com<sup>t</sup> acknowledged themselves indebted unto Thos. de Randolph Gov<sup>r</sup> of this com<sup>t</sup> & his Successor in office for the time being unto the said Harrod Doles in the sum of \$1000 and his said tenants in the sum of \$500 each to be levied of their respective goods and chattels lands & tenements to the said Governor for the use of the com<sup>t</sup> rendered - Yet upon this condition that if the said Harrod Doles shall personally appear before the Judge of the Superior court of this com<sup>t</sup> at the comthouse on the first day of the next
