

At a court summoned and held for the county of Southampton on the 21st day of August 1822 for the prosecution of Samuel Daughtrey late of the parish of Stollan and county of Southampton who stand charged with cruelly beating, wounding, maiming and otherwise ill treating Priscy otherwise called Priscy Turner a free woman of colour whereby the said woman Priscy came to her death -

The court being thus constituted the prisoner Samuel Daughtrey appeared in court according to the condition of his recognizance entered into for his appearance and thereupon his securities from their recognizance and undertaking in this behalf are discharged, and the prisoner was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this county and charged with the felony aforesaid and thereupon sworn witnesses were examined on behalf of the crown. Touching the prisoner with Henry Rawls, Polly Barnes, Rebecca Hatfield, and Miles Sturges - and the prisoner being fully heard by Robert B. Taylor his counsel. The court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty of the felony whereof he stand charged and thereupon proclamation being made in the manner and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged from further prosecution in this behalf.
