Sterling J^y appears in court according to the condition of his recognizance entered into yesterday for his appearance here and thereupon the securities for his appearance from their recognizance and undertaking in this behalf are discharged and the said Sterling J^y was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this county and charged with Feloniously stealing Falsely and carrying away from the strand of Nathan Parson (Pedlar) on the 17th day of Nov^r 1823 a Plain cloak of the value of Fifteen Dollars - (The court summoned for his examination not having ones) and thereupon seven witnesses were sworn & examined on behalf of the Count^y Touching the premises to wit Nathan Parson

and the prisoner being fully heard by counsel - The court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner ought to be tried for said offence at the next Superior court to be holden for this county - and the court are of opinion that the prisoner may be bailed in the sum of \$300 and two securities in the sum of \$150 each -

On the motion of Mary B. Brichlow It is ordered that she have leave to keep an ordinary at her home in the town of Jerusalem till the first day of May next on her giving bond and security It appearing to the satisfaction of the court that the license heretofore granted to Sand. Balvert to keep an ordinary at the same court house has been transferred to the said Mary B. Brichlow, & that the said Mary B. Brichlow is a person of good character & not addicted to drunkenness or gaming -

Mrs. C. Daughtrey having paid the tax imposed by law on ordinary keepers Therefore it is ordered that the said Mrs. C. Daughtrey have leave to keep an ordinary at her home till the first day of May next on her giving bond and security acc^y to law - It appearing to the satisfaction of the court that the said Mrs. C. Daughtrey is a woman of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming -
