Everett - And thereupon James Rochelle was declared unanimously elected clerk of this Court for the term of seven years to commence and run from and after the first Monday in July next to supply the vacancy created by an act of the General Assembly passed the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1834. intitled "an act regulating the appointment of Clerks of Courts and the Tenure of their Offices." Whereupon the said James Rochelle with Clements Rochelle, Samuel B. Davis & John B. Mason this securities here in open Court entered into & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded. The said James Rochelle also took the oath of Fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath to support the Constitution of the United States, the oath to suppress sedition and the oath of Office.

Scott & Micajah Holliman were sworn a Grand Jury of Inquest upon the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and having nothing to present were discharged.

Robert Marway appeared in Court & qualified as an Overseer of the Poor of this County according to Law.

George B. Gray & John M. Hurley this day severally produced to the Court an account of their services as Commissioners of the Revenue, and the Court having considered that 75 days each were requisite for the said Commissioners to perform the services aforesaid.
