Referred by consent of parties to William Holliman & Augustus Ballard of the County of Isle of Wight, and their umpire. and the said arbitrators are to proceed to make their award exparte in case either party shall fail to attend after receiving ten days previous notice of the time and place appointed for that purpose and the parties are to take the affidavits of their witnesses which are to be read in evidence before the arbitrators. they giving each other reasonable notice of the time and place of taking the same -

Arthur Cotton. late of this County. who stands charged with feloniously entering the corn house of Asahel Joyner. during the night of the 3^d May last. and taking therefrom one bushel of corn - was this day set to the Bar in custody of the Jailor of this Court. (The Court summoned for his examination having failed to meet) and thereupon sundry witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Complainant and the prisoner by his Counsel heard. - It is the opinion of the Court & accordingly ordered that the said Arthur Cotton be discharged from further prosecution for the said supposed offence -
