Murfee & Willie W Jenkins or any 3. be appointed Com. on the part of
this County to let the repairs or rebuilding bridge across ^{Blackwater} Halloway River at
Goquay & make rpt. &c.

Ordered that Jacob Barnes, Alexander Myrick & Selah Ellworth or any
two of them let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of Bridge across the
head of Barnes mill pond & make rpt. &c.

Overseers of the Poor & Lm. &c. to be proved & Judgment according
to the merits with costs &c.
