

Parter Attorney prosecuting for the Commonwealth on the Court filed an Information against the prisoner, and the prisoner being arraigned pleaded not guilty to the Information. And thereupon Elizabeth A. Pond & Dr. A. S. H. Dargatzis attorneys on behalf of the Commonwealth (there being no witness examined for the prisoner) were sworn and examined and the prisoner by Thomas R. Gray her counsel fully heard. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are unanimously of opinion that the prisoner is guilty in manner & form as in the Information against her is set forth, and it being demanded of the prisoner if any thing for herself she had to know to say why the Court should not now pronounce its pronounced judgment against her according to law and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of Judgment it is considered by the Court that the prisoner be taken from hence to the place from whence he came there to remain until the 21st day of ^{June} next on which day between the hours of Ten O'clock in the forenoon and Two O'clock in the afternoon she is to be taken by the Sheriff of the County to the usual place of execution and there and there hanged by the neck until she be dead. And the Court value the said Slave to the sum of three hundred & twenty two dollars -
