

At Court held for Southampton County on the 25th day September 1835-

Present James Glasgow, Seematt W. Baines.

Lillston R. Edwards is unanimously appointed clerk for term of the Court until a clerk shall be appointed to supply the vacancy created by the death of James Rockwell Esq. ^{late clerk.}

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of the Peace for the County to the first day of October ¹⁸³⁵ to elect a clerk to supply the vacancy created by the death of James Rockwell Esquire late clerk of this Court.

Absent William A. Sparks. Present James Mays. Just.

Ordered that Alexander Myrick Guardian of Ann Eliza Edgelys estate be allowed to use so much of the principal of the said Edward's estate as will satisfy an account due George & Samuel Muller amounting to \$20.75 cents.

Wentworth v. Herrell labor record & divided as per record &c.

On motion of Rebecca Stillman Ordered that Nicholas M. Seibell answer & deliver an account of her action on her husband's estate to her late husband who is directed to examine the same and file the same & make report &c.

Ordered that the account of Thomas M. Seibell father amounting to \$67.63 cents be

attached to the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment.

The last will and Testament of James Rockwell dec^d was proved by the oath of two of the witnesses thereto & Ordered to be recorded. The Executor qualified and gave bond and security according to Law.

Ordered that William C. Parker, Stephen Morrissey, John C. Turner, James P. Arnold and Nicholas M. Seibell or any three of them appear and Estate &c.

John M. Gurley is unanimously appointed Comptroller of the Revenue for St. Luke's Parish in this County for the ensuing year.

George L. H. Gray is unanimously appointed Comptroller of the Revenue for St. Lawrence Parish in this County for the ensuing year.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County out of any Court or quit money in his hands pay to Miles Hamlin for five dollars the amount of the account.

A writing bearing date the 30th day of April 1835 purporting to be the last will and Testament of Joseph Reese deceased was produced in Court for admission to probate whereupon J. P. M. Vincent appeared by his Attorney offered the proof of the said will, and thereupon sundry witnesses were sworn and examined and the parties by their Attorneys fully heard. The Court after fully hearing the evidence and upon mature deliberation short of any opinion, that the said writing is the true last will and Testament of the said Joseph Reese dec^d that the said Reese at the time of executing the said will was of sound and disposing mind and memory and that he was under no undue influence. Therefore it is ordered that the said writing be recorded as the last will and Testament of the said Joseph Reese dec^d.
