

On the motion of Sargent Sam Garrison to Elizabeth Ann Williams and to
appear before the Court that the ^{testimony} of John Davis & others, Esqrs, is now sufficient for
the defendant it is ordered that the said Garrison be permitted to make out of a negro
slave named Peter belonging to his said master - after giving him the value of the
same & release of sole, and take bond & security of the said Garrison for the payment of the
purchase money except sufficient to pay the cost of his proceeding which shall be
left for cash, and make up his deficiency to the Court.

The next few days are proposed by Garrison to be used in Virginia. Persons & negroes, bondmen
& bondswomen, apprentices & slaves of Master & Servant, apprentices of Master Servant and
their respective bond & security according to law.

Mills Garrison unanimously appointed Constable on the Sheriff's Court of Jefferson
Parish in this County to supply the vacancy created by the resignation of David B. Tracy
the last constable of whom that the said Garrison is a man of sound probity of good character
& thoroughly qualified according to law.

On motion of Sargent R. Edwards (late of the Court Monroe & W. H. C. as permitted)
to qualify as his deputy during his pleasure and thereafter the said Clerk shall be sever-
al other required by Law.

Ordered that Charles J. Beale, Sam'l & Branch & John & Hall appear the

The Commissioner appointed by an order of the last Court to act in connection with the Commissioner
appointed by the Court of Isle of Wight County in viewing the Bridge now constructed over the
Black Water River at the place called Franklin; and to report upon the propriety of removing the
same, or instead thereof to construct a draw arch on the one now standing for the passage of boats
navigating the said river, this day made their report which is confirmed & Ordered to be recorded.
And it is further ordered that as there is not a majority of the acting justices of County
present it be signed and record as the intention of this Court at the next Term thought to
make an order for the removal and erection of the said bridge pursuant to the said report
of the said Commissioners: and that the Sheriff of this County be directed to summon the
Justices of the County to attend at the next (and with a view to the said) -

It being represented to the Court that the Draw arch in the Bridge at South Quay is insufficient
to admit the passage of vessels navigating Black Water river, and that the obstructions to
such vessels arises from the fact that the Span of the arch is too contracted and the Court
being of opinion from the representation thus made that is right and proper that the obstruc-
tions in our roads of the present character should be speedily removed. On due consider-
ation the Court doth that James D. McHenry, James Moore, Wm A. Speake and Lips
Parker or any three of them who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose proceed
to act with Commissioners already appointed by the County Court of Hampshire, and enquire
whether the draw arch in the bridge at South Quay over Black Water river can be so
enlarged or constructed as to admit the passage of steam boats and other vessels nava-
gating the said river through the said Bridge, and to ascertain the extent of such
enlargement and the probable expenses which will necessarily be incurred in accomplishing
the object in contemplation. And make report of their proceedings to the Court -
