

On motion of Henry H Pond against Emma Broude Go of Martha Ann Sally & Henry Broude for Counter Security - The said Emma Broude this day appeared in Court & together with Rich^d H Broude her Security entered into & acknowledged aloud & say able to the said Henry H Pond and conditioned according to Law.

On motion of Joseph H Broude who produced the Sheriffs receipt for the tax imposed by Law & license is granted him to keep an Ordinary at his house in this County till May next next but and being of opinion that the said Broude is a man of good character & not addicted to drinking or gaming.

Bennett P Stephenson who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here this day to answer the Complaint of Priscilla Cong against him for breach of the Peace this day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance and thereupon the said Elizabeth Cong standing witness as one sworn & examined and the Deft by his attorney fully heard The Court upon ample consideration of all the circumstances doth order that the said Bennett P Stephenson give Security for his keeping the space of 12 months from this term himself to be bound in the sum of \$50. & two sureties in the sum of \$25 each. Whereupon the said Bennett P Stephenson together with John W. Mason and John A. Hall - his Security is ~~affirmed~~ in Court severally acknowledged themselves to be indebted unto the said R. Stephen Esq. Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia that is to say the said Stephenson in the sum of fifty dollars and the said Sureties in the sum of \$25 each. of their respective bonds and contents goods & chattels to be levied and to the said Lieutenant Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered & yet upon this condition that if the Bennett P Stephenson shall keep the peace and be of good behavior toward the Commonwealth & all its citizens of this ~~Commonwealth~~ more especially toward Priscilla Cong of this County for the space of 12 months from this day then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force & Motion

A Writ being taken the 18th July 1832. Remitting the Court with & Testament of Elizabeth Cong made was produced in Court for judgment whereupon James Clayton the Executor thereon named appeared in Court & refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution of the said Writ and that upon the said Writ was served by the oath of James Clayton one of the Witnesses sheweth the Regalia of Mary which on & certified to be correct

On motion of Sampson B Reese who produced the Sheriffs receipt for the Tax imposed by Law & license is granted him to keep an Ordinary at the Cross Keys in this County till May next next but and being of opinion that the said Reese is a man of good character and not addicted to drinking or gaming.

It appears to the Court from the evidence of James Powell a creditable witness that John Broy a Revolutionary Soldier died ^{in estate} in this County on 19th day of February 1832 leaving Mary Broy his Widow and no legitimate child

On motion of James P. Stoddell & James W. Mosher who severally produced the Sheriffs receipt for the tax imposed by Law License is granted them to keep an Ordinary in this County till May next next it appearing to the Court that they are men of good character & not addicted to drinking or gaming.
