Court consider the ^{proposed} plan of the public square which letting so to be subject to the
approval of the Court or rejection of the Court which letting may be made on compromise
with a separation from the jail or to the Commissioners may seem proper.

Ordered that Jeremiah Cobb be authorized to take down the brick walls of the old jail
and to take care of the old iron & other materials belonging to the said jail. for which the
said Cobb will be allowed a reasonable compensation for his services to be made. And that the
said Cobb be also authorized to use four thousand of the said bricks for which he will be
accountable for their true value.

On motion of Henry Buecher be authorized to receive of the Representatives of James Re-
shelle as late Clerk of the Court the sum of forty dollars out of the moneys deposited with
the said Clerk belonging to the children of the said Henry Buecher. that amount being paid
for the support of the said children.

Ordered that Master Com. John Exum make & settle an account of William D. Reckles

and discharge of John A. Corner and make report.

Ordered that John Nicholas be exempt from the payment of taxes & for his negroes, Billy
Jenny & Abby. Chapman aged & infirm.

On motion of Jacob J. Williamson who produced to the Court the Sheriff's receipt for the tax
imposed by the Court. The Court is granted him to keep an Ordinary at his house within County
the said Court next. the Court being of opinion that he is a man of good character and not
addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

The report of William D. Bond Darby of the County of a Darby made of a parcel of land
purchased by John A. Hill for taxes was read & ordered to be recorded.

At Court Robert J. Mangrove Present Joseph T. Deland Court.

On the motion of Penelope Byrd and for reasons appearing to the Court. It is ordered that
the Inventures binding Hyatt Byrd, Burwell Byrd, John Byrd and Mary Ann Byrd
for negroes & children of the said Penelope Byrd the James C. Harison which have been
by an order of this Court ordered to be transferred to Mary J. Harison be cancelled and made void
and that the said children be delivered to the care, custody & control of the said Penelope Byrd
and that she be allowed to take the said children to the 25th day of December next
by the Sheriff of the County. Whereupon Mary J. Harison who appears by her attorney and
opposes the said motion offered to file her exception to the opinion of the Court but the Court being of
opinion that she has no right to except offered to file her exceptions.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
