

At a Court of Quarter Sessions continued and held for Southampton County on the 22nd day of August 1837.

Denges v Brown Case Dismissed.

Shepherd for R v Myrick on Debt Dismissed.

On motion of George Johnson and for reasons appearing to the Court the order made on yesterday concerning the case of the Commonwealth against the said George Johnson for a breach of the peace is set aside and therefore the Court after hearing the evidence is of opinion that the complaint against the Defendant be dismissed - and that the said George Johnson pay the costs of this prosecution.

On the motion of Thomas Johnson and for reasons appearing to the Court the order made yesterday concerning the case of the Commonwealth against the said Thomas Johnson for a breach of the peace is set aside and therefore the said Thomas Johnson was brought into Court in custody of the jailor of this Court and Mason Johnson was sworn & examined and the said Thomas Johnson fully heard it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Thomas Johnson give security for his keeping the peace for the term of One year from this day the said Thomas Johnson to be bound in the sum of One hundred dollars with one security in the like sum of one hundred dollars. And thereupon the said Thomas Johnson together with George Johnson his security who justified as to his sufficiency, here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Excellency David Campbell Esq Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia and his successors in Office for the sum being an alibi of One hundred dollars each of their respective goods chattels lands & tenements real & personal and to the said Governor and his successors in Office for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon the condition that if the said Thomas Johnson shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour toward all the citizens of this Commonwealth more especially towards the said Mason Johnson for the term of One year from this day that this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue - And it is ordered that the said Thomas Johnson pay the costs of this prosecution.

By consent of parties the license hitherto granted Nicholas M Schell to keep an Ordinary in Jonesboro till May Court next are transferred to Jones & Schell & whereupon they gave bond of security according to Law. The Court being of opinion that the said Jones Schell are men of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming -
