Yet upon the condition that of the said Samuel M. Pond, Thomas J. Drummright, Thaddeus Sam. Richard A. Woodward, William W. Kitchin, William D. Child, Eli Barker, William E. Branch & Saml. R. Brown shall severally make their personal appearance before the Judge of the Circuit Superior Court of Law & Chancery for this County on the first day of the next Term by 12 O'clock in the morning of that day to give such evidence as they and each of them know or believe of the Commonwealth against Joseph Enos charged with felony and shall not depart without leave of the said Court then the above recognizance to be void & else to remain in full force & virtue.

Commonwealth v. Vick. Infor. On motion of Matthew Clark & William Joyner the rule made against them at June Term last for failing to attend as witnesses in this case is set aside.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till to morrow (Monday) ten O'clock.

At a Court of Quarterly Sessions continued and held for the County of Southampton on Tuesday the 21st day of August, 1835.

Ordered that Moses Little examine, state and settle the debt of Jas. Vick as Guardians of the orphan of Henry Joyner decd. and make reports for Henry Adams who stands committed to the Jail of this County for want of security of his appearance here. This to answer the complaint of Lydia Adams against him for breach of the peace was set to the bar in care of the Sheriff. And the said Lydia Adams being solemnly called and not appearing for reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that the said Complaint be dismissed and that the said Lydia Adams pay the costs thereof. On day March 1st a who stands charged by Lydia Adams a single woman with carrying off her coat and child this day appeared in Court and for reasons appearing to the Court, the Recognizance is continued until the next Court.

By G. B. Joyner v. Saml. Pickens decd. - Last. - Recognizance - each party to pay his own costs. Commonwealth v. Josiah Vick. - Jos. Vick sworn to try the issue to wit, James Turner, J. G. Little, Benjamin Simmons, Josiah Hines, Thea Simmons, Josiah Faircloth, Jos. Hoop, John L. Turner, John Moore, J. William Buffum, Lewis N. Dornick and John A. Turner who returned a verdict against the defendant for the costs, Josiah is granted for the same & costs.

Mrs. Seabrook is appointed Sawyer of the Court from John Reedland to the Supra line in the room of Lewis N. Brown deceased and it is ordered that the usual bonds as with Herson Combs v. Vick - Recognizance returned and continued until the next Court.
