

John J. Drake who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the Complaint of Julia Seabrooke against him for a breach of the peace appeared in discharge of his recognizance. Whereupon the said Julia Seabrooke being sworn & examined under oath said Drake fully heard. It is the opinion of the Court & accordingly ordered that the said John J. Drake give security for keeping the peace for the term of one year from this day, himself to be bound in the sum of \$100 with 3 securities in the sum of \$50 each, and thereupon the said John J. Drake with James W. Parker & John James his security here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto David Campbell Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia and his Successors in office that is to say the said John J. Drake in the sum of \$100. and his said securities in the sum of \$50 each to be levied of their respective goods and chattels land & Tenements and to the said Governor & his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth & its residents. Yet upon this condition that if the said John J. Drake shall keep the peace & be of good behavior towards the Commonwealth and all its citizens and especially towards the said Julia Seabrooke for the term of one year from this day that the recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force & Virtue.

The D. ft. appeared in discharge of his recognizance and Colley Blot from Henry Burton Esq. & the said Magrath being heard - the Court being divided in opinion it is ordered that the Complaint be dismissed. Present Jacob Barnes Esq. & Colley Blot will provide & Ordered to be recorded. James J. Williams the son qualified & gave bond security according to Law.

Ordered that Joseph Joyner. Thomas Joyner. Patrick Rowe & John Drake or any 2 of them appraise said estate of Edward Beaton & appraise & give bond security according to Law -
