That is to say for ^{first} ~~three~~ dollars per year for the 3 first years apprenticeship of the said Herbert & twenty five dollars per year for the residue of his apprenticeship - and the sum of \$25 per year for the said Daniel - the money due for the last year of apprenticeship to be paid to the said apprentices respectively -
