Nicholas a slave belonging to the estate of Nathaniel Cargill dec^d who stands charged
 with having on the 23rd day of August 1840 at Barnetts meeting house in this County feloniously
 conspired advised and conspired to rebel and make insurrection on this day set to the law
 custody of the Jailor of this County (the Court summoned for his criminal having failed to work)
 and being arraigned pleaded not guilty and stood for Sunday witness were shown & examined by
 Nansha a negro being duly charged Herons testified that at Barnetts meeting house within
 County on Sunday the 23rd day of August last where there was a collection of both white & black
 people she heard the prisoner at the bar who with another negro from Petersburg & several
 negroes were standing together say he was good of the rise and kill all the white people and
 asked the other negro from Petersburg if he would join him he said he would and should
 the prisoner said he would join him. The conversation lasted about half an hour. She first
 saw the prisoner between the Meeting house & Hill when she next saw him it was at the
 place where the camp then above referred to was held. Upon being cross examined she
 solemnly said the other negro from Petersburg asked Nicholas the prisoner first if he would
 join him Nicholas said he would & the other negro said he would join Nicholas to kill
 all the white people - Two of the negroes present at the conversation were named Dany
 and Dany she did not know the others - witness says she did not know Nicholas the prisoner & the
 other negro from Petersburg ask any other negro present if they would join them - witness
 related was standing about ten steps from Nicholas when the conversation was going on
 and heard it distinctly - She the witness spoke of the conversation to her Master Dick the
 day after it occurred. who says she has the name of it in her mind (who says she has the name of it in her mind)
 witness about it in two or three days after - a girl by the name of Jellman had told her
 previously that when she inquired some of the negroes would kill all the white people and
 that that was the conversation she related to her Master Dick

Dolly negro woman being duly charged Herons testified that she was present
 Meeting house on the day above alluded to. that when at this place near the meeting
 house a white man whom she did not know came there and asked Nicholas the prisoner at the
 bar to hand him some water after she returned he left Nicholas could hear and
