On motion of Benjamin J. Smith, Matthew W. Vaughan & Harris on Behalf of Harris on Behalf  
Dec<sup>r</sup> Ordered that William M. Jones who is hereby appointed Special Commissioner for the purpose to  
make, settle and adjust an additional account of the said Smiths, Vaughan & Harris accounts  
proceeding in their Testator estates, correcting all errors of any, in the former settlement and make  
report thereof to the Court.

Accounts of James E. Peters adm<sup>r</sup> on Rebecca J. Barrows est. of father  
J. Williams adm<sup>r</sup> on Richard Masons est. of James J. Williams Est. proceeding as Matly  
Jenkins est. of Rice B. Peices adm<sup>r</sup> on Peter J. Peices est. & of John L. Thrope adm<sup>r</sup> on  
Wm. A. Parsons est. were severally returned & ordered to lie on the Court for exceptions.

An account of James E. Peters guardianship of Rebecca J. Barrowsophans was not yet  
to be recorded.

Nelson a slave belonging to the estate of Peter Bostle deceased who stands charged with  
killing on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of August on the year 1840 at Barrells meeting house in the  
County feloniously conspired, advised and empowered to rebel and make insurrection, and  
to be the bar in custody of the jailer of this County. (The Court summoned for his trial being  
failed to meet and being duly arraigned pleaded not guilty, and thereupon sundry  
witnesses were sworn and examined to wit: Nancy a negro girl supposed to be about  
13 or 14 years of age, being first duly charged & sworn Testifies that she was at Barrells  
meeting house in this County on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of August last where there was a considerable  
collection of persons both white & black that she does not know the persons at the bar and  
does not know that she saw him there.

Polly a negro being also duly charged & sworn Testifies that she was at the meeting  
house above named on the day aforesaid that she does not know the persons at the bar  
and does not recollect seeing him there.

Duffy a negro man being duly charged & sworn Testifies that he is acquainted  
with the prisoner that he saw him at Barrells meeting house on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of  
August last, but he heard him say nothing or take any part in the conversation with  
Nicholas, who is yesterday examined, and three negroes who were conspiring  
consulting & advising to rebel & make insurrection.

Bostle a negro man being duly charged & sworn Testifies that he is acquainted  
with the prisoner at the bar that he saw him at Barrells meeting house in  
this County on the day above mentioned, to wit 23<sup>d</sup> of August 1840 that he then
