Ordered that the Deft out of any contingent money in his hands pay Thomas C Jones \$20.75 the amount of his account.

Upon the petition of James Turner, Patsy Williams, Gully Williams & John Williams descendants of a female of the Molloray Tribe of Indians. It appearing that the Trustees of the said Tribe of Indians have had due notice of this petition - It is ordered that the Trustees do ascertain & set apart to the petitioners their proportion of the estate real & personal held in trust for the benefit of the said Tribe & make report thereof to Court. It appearing to the Court that the petitioners are not likely to become chargeable to any part of the Commonwealth.

The Court certifies that William D Gentry who wishes to obtain a license to practice the law in the Courts of this Commonwealth has resided in this Court for the last preceding 12 months that he is a person of honest demeanor & appears of 21 years of age.

On motion of Thomas Doyal Ordered that James Holmes, Pollock Rowe & James Williams being sworn before a Justice of the Peace do view the way proposed by the said Doyal for altering a road as well as the present way, and report to the Court the comparative convenience & inconvenience of the same.
