It is the opinion of the Court & accordingly ordered that the said Bennett Joyner shall give security for keeping the peace for the term of 12 months from this day the said Joyner to be bound in the sum of \$100 with four securities in the sum of \$25 each and that the said Bennett Joyner pay the costs of this prosecution - Whereupon the said Bennett Joyner with William Cobb, Benjamin Cobb, Shadrack Riddle & Joseph Murchison here in Court severally acknowledge themselves indebted unto John Rutherford ex<sup>c</sup> Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of this Commonwealth that is to say the said Bennett Joyner and the sum of \$100 and the said William Cobb, Benjamin Cobb, Shadrack Riddle & Joseph Murchison in the sum of \$25 each to be levied of their goods & chattels, lands and tenements and to the said Governor the sum for the service of the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that of the said Bennett Joyner shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour towards the Commonwealth & all its citizens more especially towards the said Charles Ingram that the recognizance to be now made to remain in full force.

On motion of Archibald P. P. Pond & wife Ordered that James Gray guardian to the said wife who was Mary Marshall settle his guardian account before Master Comptroller Cobb who is directed to examine same & make report. On motion of Wiley Parker guardian to Godwin Parker Ordered that Hennig J Smith late guardian of Godwin Parker render an account of his guardianship before Mr. Comptroller Cobb who is directed to examine same & make written statement & report.

Inventory & appraisement of Symon Vaughan deceased & ordered to be made & recorded.

The last Will & Testament of Temperance Moore deceased was proved by the wife of John Mungar one of the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.
