The Last Will & Testament of Hartwell Hart dec^d was proved by the oath of Joshua Hart James H. Morris & Edgar A. Morris the subscribing witnesses thereof & ordered to be recorded And in the will of Benjamin L. Druce the executor therein named who made oath & gave bond & security according to Law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Charles Hart Joshua Hart Phineas M. Bailey & Thomas Atkins or any 3 of them being sworn & appraise all the personal & real estate of Hartwell Hart dec^d & return the same to Court.

The Court doth assign Benjamin L. Druce guardian To George R. Hart orphan of Hartwell Hart dec^d and thereupon he gave bond & security according to Law.

William Howell laborer who stands charged with stealing one short hog or pig within the County of Southampton the property of James Cobb and of the value of one dollar, was affirmed in Court on a charge of his recognizance (the Court recommended for his examination by Justice of the Peace) and thereupon the said William Howell was set to the law in custody of the Sheriff of this County, and sundry witnesses being sworn & examined and the prisoner being fully heard, the Court after hearing the testimony and from all the circumstances of the case being of opinion that the offense of which the said William Howell was charged is cognizable before the County Court of this County doth remand the said William Howell to Jail to take his trial accordingly at the next quarterly Term of this County. And on the motion of the prisoner & the Court being of opinion that the same is a lawful trial Ordered that the prisoner be allowed to give bail for himself to be bound in the sum of two hundred and with two sureties in the sum of One hundred dollars each, such money to be paid before any Justice of the Peace after the coming of this Court.
