was awarded them to examine & take the depositions of witnesses to the road as evidence on this

The Court appointed to let the repairs of Long bridge this day made a report which ordered to be
recorded

Ordered that the bill of this Court out of any contingent money in his hands not otherwise appro-
priated pay to Joseph Drury the sum of One hundred dollars for repairs & to Long bridge
Williams & Bickel & Co. City. The Court spares heretofore appointed in this case this day made
report.

Richmond Edwards who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here this day, appeared in
Court on discharge of his recognizance, and thereupon the said Elizabeth Litchman and Sunday
other witnesses being sworn & examined and the said Richmond Edwards fully heard. The Court after
hearing the testimony and from all the circumstances of the case are of opinion & do accordingly order
that the said Richmond Edwards give security for keeping the peace for the term of twelve months
from this day that is to say the said Edwards to be bound in the sum of \$100. with two sureties in
the sum of \$50 each. and that he also pay the costs of this prosecution

being solemnly called and not appearing. The said motion is continued till the next Court.

Barton Taylor & David Murren having been guilty of an affray by fighting together in public
in the Court yard, were brought into Court and standing before being examined and the said Taylor
& Murren fully heard. It is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Barton
Taylor & David Murren give security for keeping the peace for the term of twelve months from this
day that is to say the said Taylor & Murren to be bound in the sum of \$100 each with two
sureties in the sum of \$50 each and that they pay the costs of this prosecution -
Whereupon the said Barton Taylor with George Williams & Thomas B. Bickel his sureties
here in Court solemnly acknowledged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford Esq. Lieutenant Gov-
ernor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Barton Taylor in the
sum of \$100 and the said George Williams & Thomas B. Bickel in the sum of \$50 each of
their respective goods & chattels to be levied and to the said Governor and Esq.
Lieutenant Governor in the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth, provided (it appears this
condition that if the said Barton Taylor shall keep the peace & keep good behavior toward
all the Citizens of the Commonwealth for the space of twelve months from this day then this
recognizance to be void, or else to run and in full force & virtue -
and the said David Murren with Edwin Harris and Elizabeth Boulden
his sureties here in Court solemnly acknowledged themselves indebted unto John
Rutherford Esq. Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia
that is to say the said David Murren in the sum of \$100. and the said Edwin Harris
