Deed of bargain and sale from Jacobus Story and Polly his wife and Thos. to James Hall conveying a tract of Land containing 159 Acres, bel the same more or less was proved in the Clerk's Office on the 28th September 1841 by the witnesses thereto and together with the Certificate of the jury examination and acknowledgment of the wives admitted to Record =

Deed of bargain and sale from Pelly Stephens to William L. Stephens conveying to trust of
Land containing 38 acres more or less was proved in the County Office on the 20th September 1941
by the oath of all elements one of the witnesses Threlkeld and having been proved on the 21st June 1941 by
William Stephens and on the 19th of April 1941 by Goodwin & Giffins two other witnesses
Threlkeld was admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between James J. Williams of the first part James Cobb of the second part and Abner Redden of the third part conveying a tract of land containing 150 acres & horse saddle and bridle 1 hog head and 20 hogs 20 barrels Corn. 1000 pounds Bacon also his the said Williams entire stock of and furniture 20 Hogs 20 barrels Corn. 1000 pounds Bacon also his the said Williams share and interest to wad

Deed was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 20th September 1841 by all the parties thereof and admitted to record.

Deed of Trust between John A. Turner of the first part James D. Bryant of the second part and John A. Bailey and others of the third part conveying but the said Turners present growing crops of Cotton and all the surplus that may be coming to him after satisfying the trust moneys which he had on was previously was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 24th day of September 1861 by John A. Turner and James D. Bryant and John A. Bailey and others and submitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Jacob Forester of the first part Robert P. Bunnell of the second part and Thomas B. Merrill of the third part conveying a gig wood swamp & large Iron hills four fifths of the said swamp to his present growing crop of Cedar and spruce and all his crop of forest use as the surplus which may be coming to him after satisfying the several debts of trust he had given previously
