 being the father of her bastard child this day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance  
 and thereupon the said Battle confessed himself to be the father of the said bastard child and the  
 Court are of opinion that the said child is likely to become chargeable to the County - Therefore it  
 is ordered that the said Battle be charged with the sum of \$25 for the support  
 of the said child and that he pay the same <sup>at the end of every year</sup> until the child is of legal age and from  
 poor of this County, and that he also pay the Costs of this prosecution - Whereupon the  
 said Dwight Battle with William D Phillips <sup>in James Ball</sup> his Sureties appeared in Court & severally acknowl-  
 edged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford esq. Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor  
 of the Commonwealth that to pay the said Dwight Battle in the sum of \$200 and the  
 said William D Phillips <sup>James Ball</sup> in the sum of \$100, of their respective goods & chattels  
 lands & Tenements to be levied and to the said Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor and  
 his Successor in the Office of the Governor to the use of the Commonwealth rendered - Not  
 upon the condition that if the said Dwight Battle shall keep & observe the above order  
 of the Court made against him then this recognizance to be void.

 free negroes, were examined & confessed to be truly made

Joseph G. Connell who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer  
 the complaint of Patrick Dole for a breach of the peace this day appeared in discharge of  
 his recognizance - and thereupon the said Patrick Dole being sworn & examined and the said  
 Joseph G. Connell by his Counsel fully heard - The Court after hearing the Testimony from  
 all the circumstances of the case are of opinion & do hereby Order that the said Joseph G.  
 Connell find security for keeping the peace for the Term of Twelve months from this day  
 that is to say the said Connell to be bound in a recognizance for the sum of three hundred  
 dollars with 2 Sureties in the sum of \$150 each - and that the said Connell also pay  
 the Costs of this prosecution - Whereupon the said Joseph G. Connell with James M.  
 Connell & John P. Boylston his Sureties here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted  
 unto John Rutherford esq. Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth  
 of Missouri that to say the said Joseph G. Connell in the sum of three hundred Dollars  
 and the said James M. Connell & John P. Boylston in the sum of \$150 each of their re-  
 spective goods & chattels lands & Tenements to be levied and to the said acting Governor  
 and his Successor in the Office of Governor to the Commonwealth rendered - Not upon  
 the condition that if the said Joseph G. Connell shall keep the peace & good behavior  
 towards the Commonwealth and all its citizens more especially towards the said Patrick  
 Dole for the Term of 12 months from this day then this recognizance to be void -
