Lumsier conveying a tract of land containing 189 acres more or less was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 4th December 1841 by Sterling H. Lumsier and together with the Certificate of the proper examination and acknowledgment of the wife admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Daniel H. Lumsier and Rebecca his wife of the first part William St. Edwards of the second part and Sterling H. Lumsier of the third part conveying a tract of land containing 189 acres more or less was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 2nd December 1841 by two of the parties thereto and together with the Certificate of the proper examination and acknowledgment of the wife admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between the Portsmouth and Round Bay Rail Road Company of the first part John H. Haines Richard H. Deed of trust between James Sherrod of the first part Nicholas Bond of the second part and John B. Sherrod of the third part conveying 16 head of horses 16 head of Cattle 70 head of hogs one full set one double gig and harness one single gig and harness 2 Carts and wheels one saddle 200 barrels corn 14 stacks blue feed and one stack oats was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 12th day of December 1841 by two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.
