Court after hearing the Testimony & from all the circumstances of the case doth order
that the said Bennett give security for keeping the peace for the Term of twelve months
from this day the said Branch to be bound in the sum of £200 with his Sureties in the
sum of £100 each and that the said Neust Branch also pay the costs of this prosecution
Whereupon the said Neust Branch with Miles Pepe & Penoch Branch
his Sureties here in Court formally acknowledge themselves indebted unto John Rutherford
Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia that is to say
the said Neust Branch in the sum of £200 & Miles Pepe & Penoch Branch
and his said Sureties in the sum of £100 each of their respective good & Chattel land
and Tenements to be levied on to the said Acting Governor this Surety in the Office of
Governor to the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon the condition that if the
said Neust Branch shall keep the peace & be of good behavior toward all the citizens
of this Commonwealth more especially toward the said Bennett P. Stephenson for twelve
months from this day then the above recognizance to be void or else to remain in
full force.

in the sum of £100 each of their respective good & Chattel land and Tenements to be levied
on to the said Governor this Surety in the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth
rendered. Yet upon the condition that of the said Neust Branch shall keep the
peace & be of good behavior toward all the citizens of this Commonwealth more especially
toward the said Bennett P. Stephenson for the Term of twelve months from this day then
the recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force.

from the 11th day of February 1842 till paid & Costs.
