Be it remembered that Lucy Cobb, William Cobb & Benjamin Cobb here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto John W Gregory Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Lucy Cobb in the sum of fifty dollars and the said Benjamin Cobb William Cobb in the sum of \$25 each of which respective good & chattels lands and Tenements to be levied and to the said Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor and his Successors in the Office of Governor for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Lucy Cobb shall keep the peace and be of good Behaviour towards all the Citizens of the Commonwealth for the term of twelve months from this day then this recognizance to be void.
