- The Clerk this day returned a list of the Deeds admitted to record in his Office since the last preceding term of this Court which list having been inspected by the Court is ordered to be inserted in the minutes of the proceedings of the day and is as follows:
- Deed of bargain and sale from David Lewis and his wife Eliza Allen Edwards & his wife Eliza and Ireland Turner of the one part and Benjamin Griffin of the other part conveying land was proved in the Clerk's Office on the 19th day of September 1842 by one of the witnesses and having been before proved by two of the other witnesses thence together with the Certificate of the jury examination and acknowledgment of the wives admitted to Record.
- Deed of Trust between William D. Phillips of the first part John M. Gurley of the second part and James D. Bryant of the third part conveying land and the following slaves and other personal property to wit: Margaret Ann Kelly, Jerry, Harry, Jesse, Norman, Cuba, Margaret Patty and their future increase, hogs, sheep and cattle and their future increase, bed and furniture chairs, hutch furniture, farming utensils, growing crop of Corn, Cotton, &c. Tobacco, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 19th day of September 1842 by all the parties thence and admitted to Record.
- Deed of Trust between William Vick of the first part, Thomas Dwyer of the second part and John Gray of the third part conveying Cider Presses, Corn fodder, beds and furniture and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 19th Sept 1842 by Vick & Dwyer two of the parties thence and admitted to Record.
- Deed of Trust between John M. Woodford of the first part James McLemore of the second part and Alexander McLemore of the third part conveying horses, cattle, beds and furniture chairs and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 19th day of Sept 1842 by all the parties thence and admitted to Record.
- Deed of Release from Bennett L. Whitfield and John Hargrave to William M. Butler releasing a certain tract of land was proved in the Clerk's Office the 19th day of Sept 1842 by the ratification of three of the witnesses thence and admitted to Record.
- Deed of bargain and sale from William M. Butler of the one part and George Butler of the other part conveying one certain tract of Land and his interest in two other tracts of Land turned by the name of the Tany game and Virginia tracts also all his growing crops of all kinds was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 19th day of Sept 1842 by the said William M. Butler and admitted to Record.
- Deed of Trust between William J. Cotton of the first part Jesse Dwyer of the second part and S and S Dwyer of the third part conveying Slaves, horses, cattle, hogs and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 20th day of Sept 1842 by all the parties thence and admitted to Record.
- Deed of Trust between William M. Butler of the first part Asa B. Butler of the second part and William Barden of the third part conveying, beds and furniture, Table, chest and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 21st day of Sept 1842 by the parties thence and admitted to Record.
- Deed of Trust between Thomas Bewan Jnr and Elizabeth P his wife of the first part Th. D. Brown Jr of the second part and Milton G. Brown of the third part conveying crop of Corn and fodder was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 21st day of Sept 1842 by all the parties thence and admitted to Record.
- Deed of Trust between James L. Anderson of the first part Jesse Dwyer of the second part and Henry Pettway of the third part conveying, horses, hells & saddle and other personal property was
