 land was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December 1842 by  
 Spoffle Hale a party thereto and together with the certificate of the party examining  
 and acknowledgement of the wife admitted to Record.

 Office the 4<sup>th</sup> day of December 1842 by all the parties thereto and admitted  
 to Record.
