Rutten & Robert Rutten the witnesses thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Willis E. Deal to Joel Vick, conveying land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 16th day of January 1843 by said Deal & admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Levi Walker of the first part, William M. Conitt of the second part and Nathaniel Francis of the third part, conveying land and negro slaves, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 16th day of January 1843 by said Walker & Conitt two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from James Jackson to George Booth, conveying land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 16th day of January 1843 by said Jackson & admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from John H. Reese and his wife Mark S.
