Deed of trust between Elisha Pope of the first part, Elizab Ellsworth of the second part and Matthew Pick of the third part. Conveying land was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Lawson Blal of the first part, John M. Guly of the second part & Nathaniel S. Williams of the third part conveying land and horses, cattle hogs & other personal property, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by said Neal & Williams two of the parties thereto & admitted to Record.

Bill of Sale from William Bryant to Henry Windred conveying his & the said Bryant's interest in the slaves negroes of Temperance McBray and widow of Charles Bryant etc. was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by said Bryant & admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Richardson Edwards to John D. Williams conveying his (and Edwards) interest in land over right of Harvey Edwards, both real and personal. Also all his interest in the Estate of Elizabeth Williams, of all descriptions, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by the said Edwards and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain & sale from Samuel W. Sims to William J. Correll high Sheriff conveying the grange of land, with one half acre of land attached to each, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by said Sims and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Benjamin Cobb of the first part, Samuel Kello of the second part and John M. Guly of the third part, Conveying Land, tools & cattle and other personal property, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain & sale from Robert Pittles to William Cobb conveying Land was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by said Pittles & admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from James Joyner junr to Israe Blith, conveying Land was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 19<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by James Joyner a party plaintiff and together with the certificate of the survey examination and acknowledgement of the wife admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Daniel Fowler of the first part, James Holmes of the second part and Carr Bowens of the third part. Conveying land & negro slaves, was proved in the Clerks Office the 19<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by the oath of Solomon Junius Wilson & Ludlow Lawrence two of the witnesses thereto. And in the Clerks Office the 19<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 the Indenture was proved by the oath of William Turner another witness thereto & admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Sibly S. Williams of the first part, John Haddill of the second part and Britton Barkley junr of the third part. Conveying a certain lot in Jerusalem was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 20<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by said Williams a party plaintiff and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Britton Barkley junr to Sibly S. Williams conveying a certain lot lying and being in the town of Jerusalem, was returned in the Clerks Office the 20<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 together with the certificates thereto annexed & admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Daniel Fowler of the first part, John R. Williams of the second part and Nelson R. Gardner of the third part Conveying land negro slaves, hidge cows & other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1843 by all the parties
