Deed of gift from John P. Gualtney to the Trustees of Phineas Mc. Gorham's Estate conveying a lot or parcel of negroes now in the possession of the said John P. Gualtney in right of his wife and their increase, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1843 by said Gualtney & admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Solomon J. Barnham of the first part, Littleton R. Edwards of the second part and John H. Gerley both of Strong & Fielding & Mahone Daniel H. Drayngate, L. P. Parsons, William H. Whitchurch, Charles Kultess, William Carter and all the other creditors of the said Solomon J. Barnham of the third part, conveying negro slaves, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of January 1843 by Barnham, Edwards, Gerley & Mahone four of the parties thence and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Benjamin Burn of the first part Clemente Rochelle of the second part and James M. gel (Trustee) of the third part conveying land negro slaves horses cattle hogs and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 28<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by all the parties thence & admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Thomas J. Pellow to Thomas Pellow conveying Land was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 28<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by said Thos J. Pellow and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Arthur B. Magot of the first part, Everett Carr of the second part and George Hennings (Trustee) of the third part, conveying a negro slave, horse, cattle hogs and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 1843 by all the parties thence and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Joseph T. Williams to William L. Williams conveying his (JTW) interest in a certain tract of land, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of February 1843 by said J. T. Williams and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between John H. Rose of the first part Martha T. Peale of the second part and Sampson C. Rose Nathaniel Fairncis, John Dowdy & Henry Moore all of the third part, conveying land, negro slaves, horses, cattle and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of February 1843 by John H. Rose & Martha T. Peale two of the parties thence and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between William L. Williams of the first part Spradly L. Williams of the second part and Thomas J. Pellow of the third part, conveying his (W.L. Williams) interest in a certain tract of land (including the interest in the widow's dower) but Matthew Williams his & one negro slave was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 4<sup>th</sup> day of February 1843 by all the parties thence and admitted to Record.

Deed of Bargain & Sale from John H. Booth to Edward Bell, conveying his Booth's interest in the estate of Peter Booth deceased was proved in the Clerks Office the 7<sup>th</sup> day of January 1843 by the oath of William A. Bell a witness thence And in the Clerks Office the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of February 1843 this deed was proved by the oath of Patrick H. Rolling another witness admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Benj Brownings of the first part Peter Edwards & John Whitchurch and Nathaniel Jones of the second and David H. Mason of the third part conveying land horses, cattle and other personal property, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 8<sup>th</sup> day of February 1843 by Benj Brown a party thence and admitted to Record, And in the Clerks Office the 15<sup>th</sup> day of February 1843 this deed was acknowledged by D.
