Deed of trust between Daniel M Simmons of the first part Edwin D Nash of the second part and Richard Darden of the third part conveying 4 acres negro slaves household and kitchen furniture, and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of March 1843 by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between John H Reed of the first part William L Everett of the second part and Benjamin C Pope Ruth best L Warham Nathaniel James and Amy Moore of the third part conveying his (H Reeds) crops of every kind made by him the present year and his interest in the property heretofore conveyed to Mary C Peale for the benefit of Sampson Cleen & others, was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 6<sup>th</sup> day of March 1843 by Reed and Pope two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Mary Revel to Jacob Barnes conveying her survivorship interest in the Estate of Helpay Revel which interest consists of land now in the possession of her father John Revel was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 11<sup>th</sup> day of March 1843 by said Mary Revel and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from John Woodson to Daniel H Griswold conveying land was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March 1843 by said Woodson and a witness to record.

A convey contract between Thomas Bevan of the first part Elizabeth P B ranch of the second part Patrick H Rolling and Henry Booth of the third part conveying negro slaves household & kitchen furniture and other personal property was proved in the Clerks Office the 11<sup>th</sup> day of January 1842 by the oath of John A Still one of the witnesses thereto And in the Clerks Office the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1843

This Indenture was acknowledged by all the parties thereto & admitted to Record. Deed of trust between Thomas Brown of the first part Henry Booth & Patrick H Rolling of the second part and Elizabeth P Bevan of the third part conveying his (the said Thos Bevan) right title and interest in right of his wife in the pecuniary or money part or portion of the Estate of Peter Booth deceased was acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1843 by Thomas Bevan, Rolling and Booth three of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.
