Arkham, Nathaniel James and Amy Moore of the third part, conveying her (Mrs) crops of every kind made by him the said parent year and his interest in the property hereof conveyed to Mary P. Pale for the benefit of Sampson Reese & others, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 6th day of March 1843, by Reese and Pope two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.
