

Deed of bargain and admitted to Record

Deed of trust between William Griffin of the first part, James Hester of the second part and Benjamin Griffin of the third part. Conveying Meads and furniture, etc. chairs, tables and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843, by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Edwin Hallett and wife to Thomas Patton conveying land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843 by Edwin Hallett of party thereto and together with the certificate of the privy examination & acknowledgment of the wife, admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Sally and Charlotte Parrell to Jacob H. Adams conveying their residuary interests in the lands of the late Hally, Parrell deceased, which lands are now in the possession of John Parrell, was proved in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843 by the oaths of J. T. Griffin Recorder & Benjamin Adams three of the witnesses thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Benjamin Hart of the first part, John A. Hart of the second part and Benjamin Adams of the third part. Conveying land was proved in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843, by the oaths of William O. Branch James M. Wain and Nicholas H. Wain the witnesses thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Peter Sambo of the first part, John R. Rochelle of the second part and Edward Denton of the third part. Conveying house lots, corn and other personal property was proved in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843, by the oaths of Edward Pope William R. Rochelle and Lauren Ruck the witnesses thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Daniel Bass and wife to Harriett Beale conveying land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843, by Daniel Bass of party thereto and together with the certificate of the privy examination & acknowledgment of the wife, admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between John R. Rochelle of the first part, William L. Canfield of the second part and Sampson B. Rice and William L. Rochelle of the third part. Conveying negro slaves, land, and his (J. R. Rochelle's) interest in the Power negro and land of Mary A. Kerby, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843, by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Albert H. Nicholson to George A. M. Newton conveying land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843, by said Albert H. Nicholson and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Albert H. Nicholson of the first part, John M. Gaskin of the second part and Solomon J. Basham of the third part. Conveying his (the said A. H. Nicholson's) interest in certain negro hands, also his interest in the lands and the hold as dower by Mrs. Ann Brown, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843, by Nicholson and Basham two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Thomas C. Jones to the Sheriff of South Carolina County conveying his interest in a certain tract of land lying near Jerusalem also his interest in five houses and lots in the town of Jerusalem, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843, and together with the certificate thereto annexed of his acknowledgment before two Justices of the peace, admitted to Record.
