Deed of Trust between Elijah Nelson and wife of the first part James W. Parker of the second part and Henry B. Vaughan of the third part conveying Land was a party thereto and together with the certificate of the jury examination and acknowledgment of the wife admitted to Record. And in the Clerk's Office the 31st day of March 1843, this indenture was acknowledged by James W. Parker another party thereto.

Bill of Sale from Sonah C. Smith to James W. Munson conveying a negro slave was proved in the Clerk's Office the 30th day of March 1843, by the oaths of James Moslemburg and Edward C. Munson the witnesses thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Joseph C. Mendaugh and wife to Daniel McDermott conveying Land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 31st day of March 1843 by J. C. Mendaugh a party thereto and together with the certificate of the jury examination and acknowledgment of the wife admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Joseph C. Mendaugh and wife to Elizabeth C. Mendaugh conveying Land, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 31st day of March 1843 by J. C. Mendaugh a party thereto and together with the certificate of the jury examination and acknowledgment of the wife admitted to Record.

Deed of Release from Thomas D. Knight Jacob Williams and Sampson Coker to Wells C. Gray releasing Land, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 31st day of March 1843, by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between John Simmons of the first part William J. Sebell of the second part and Edwards Balle of the third part conveying Land, horse, cattle, pigs and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 1st day of April 1843 by Simmons and Sebell two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record. And in the Clerk's Office the 5th day of April 1843 this indenture was acknowledged by Edwards Balle the other party thereto.

Deed of bargain and sale from George Wendall and wife to John Richardson conveying Land was returned in the Clerk's Office the 5th day of April, and together with the certificate thereto annexed of their acknowledgment before two Justices of the peace admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Samuel S. Nicholson of the first part Edwin Nash of the second part and George A. H. Newsum and John W. Rochelle of the third part conveying two horses, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 5th day of April 1843, by Nicholson and Nash two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Martha Whitfield, Harrison D. Soper and Jacob Barnes conveying Land was proved in the Clerk's Office the 20th day of March 1843 by the oaths of J. Darrow and William Drake two of the witnesses thereto. And in the Clerk's Office the 5th day of April 1843, this indenture was proved
