

Glynn v. Blaund Esq. Inv Case The defendant pleads Non agit  
and upon being thereupon joined the case is continued till the next Term

Bland v. Peete Case, a jury to sit. Teste H. Bishop Esq. attorney  
for Mr. Caymin Whitbread James H. Bell & John Marshall John  
Tate John J. Bain Collier William Augustus J. Simmons Thomas J. Eley  
James Drake & Williams were sworn to try the issue & returned a  
verdict assessing the plaintiff's damages at £6. 30 with interest  
from the 1<sup>st</sup> of Jan 1842 till paid. Therefore by consent it is  
considered that the plaintiff recover against the defendants the  
damages & interest aforesaid & the costs.

An Copy of the Report of the Commissioners appointed by the Circuit  
Court to inspect the jail of this County was this day produced  
to the Court. Whereupon it is ordered that George A. M. Newson  
Genl. P. Nicholson Fielding & Malone be appointed Commissioners  
any two of whom may act to let to the lowest undertaker the  
repairs necessary to the said jail that the Sheriff of this County  
cause the present store to be repaired and purchase another one for  
the use of said jail and present his account to the Court.

Barker v. Drury Case. A jury to sit. Teste H. Bishop, Hillary  
Forbes, James H. Bell & Aug. J. Simmons. Thomas J. Eley William Taylor  
Aug. C. Carroll A. P. Williamson John Bain Collier Robert James Drake  
were sworn de jure of the damages in this suit returned a verdict  
assessing the party damages at £37. 25/100 with interest from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1845  
till paid. Therefore it is considered that the party recover against the Dft.  
the damages & interest aforesaid & the costs.

The Register of Boley attorney for negro was examined & certified to be truly  
made.

Ordered that the account of David D. Ains Hff of this County amounting to  
£10. 6s be certified to the Auditor of public accounts for his examination & pay.

Ordered that the Hff. out of any contingent money in his hand not otherwise  
appropriated pay Miss Corp three dollars for repair of bridge at Maynards  
Mill.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next term
