Prov' Waller having made complaint before <sup>the</sup> justice of the peace  
of this County that Drury Bibb his debtor was removing out  
of this County privately or ~~and~~ concealed or ~~concealed~~ himself  
that the ordinary process of Law could not be served upon him  
and the said ~~justice~~ having granted an attachment against  
the estate of the said Drury Bibb returnable to this court which  
has been tried on sundry goods and chattels. the said Prov'  
Waller this day appeared by his attorney and the said Drury  
Bibb being solemnly called but came not. And Wm Wharton  
James H. Schell Coroner who claimed the property named  
upon and the said Prov' Waller and the said Schell  
affirmed by their attorneys fully heard. It is considered by the  
Court that the Plaintiff <sup>as</sup> come against the defendant the  
sum of two dollars with interest from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January  
1847 till paid and his costs by him about his suit in this  
behalf expended. And it is ordered that the Officer who  
served the said attachment after selling and disposing of the  
goods & chattels attached as aforesaid and satisfied the judgment  
this day rendered on the attachment in favor of the Plaintiff <sup>as</sup> perfo'ed  
Barkham Benjamin & Waller Sampson & Rose James H. Person and  
Peter Edwards that he apply the balance in satisfaction of the  
judgment. And if any surplus should then remain return to the defendant.  
And the said officer is required to return to the Clerk's Office within thirty  
days after the said sale is made and completed an account of the sale specifying  
from whom the several articles sold the persons to whom sold and the price thereof  
I'll know and stand to the judgment given for the plaintiff <sup>as</sup> written and nothing  
more. James H. Schell Coroner as before mentioned and tendered his bill of  
receipts, which bill was received signed sealed by the Clerk and ordered to  
be made a part of the record upon his motion.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the  
next term.
