 appearing On Motion of the Petitioners by his Attorney it is Ordered  
 that John W Parker be appointed Commissioner to ascertain the  
 interest of the said Edwin Turner in the estate Real and personal  
 held in trust for the benefit of the said tribe and Report to the  
 court.

The last Will and Testament of Dennis White was proved by  
 the Clerk of Hartwell Bailey one of the subscribing witnesses thereto

that Part of Barry was and is also from Nathaniel M. Debore  
 and others to Henry Tarr and two others from the said Debore and  
 others to Davis Bryant was proved by the Clerk of Mayfield Cott and  
 of the Distresses Debore and James H. Williamson another witness  
 to the said deed being called Jacob H. Chamberlain being sworn  
 depositor of said deed that he is acquainted with the hand writing  
 of the said Jas H. Williamson and very certain that the Name  
 of the said Williamson to the said deed subscribed is in the  
 proper hand writing of the said Jas H. Williamson and the  
 deed having been before proved by the Clerk of Mayfield Cott  
 & witness to the said deed is ordered to be recorded

The Court proceeded to appoint a Commissioner to Ascend the  
 Commonwealth in the court and the vote of the Court being  
 taken in ballot stood as follows.
