

On Motion of Anthony Wendell: Ordered that the estate of Mary Jones be committed to the hands of Joseph Wendell Shiff for administration according to Law

On Motion of John Martin: Ordered that he be exempted from the payment of taxes in future he being aged and infirm

At June Court 1830, on the petition of Alexander P. Peter for leave to open a new road from near his house to John D. Teller which by reference to the said order will be seen was granted to the petitioner on condition the said road was graded and put in legal repair which requisitions this Court is satisfied was fully complied with by opening the said road and erecting a bridge across the poplar swamp at the expense of the persons in the neighborhood and it appears to this Court that no further action was ever had on the subject so as to confirm and establish the same as a public road notwithstanding it has been used as such ever since its completion John D. Teller now appearing before this Court and petitioning the same to be revived and established as a public road. It is ordered the petition be granted and the road to run as was then opened commencing at the road leading over Morris bridge passing by Peter's Trading house crossing the poplar swamp where the said new bridge was erected thence along the said new cut road to the road leading over Iron bridge which is the direct road to Petersburg near the place John D. Teller formerly resided. It is ordered that John D. Teller be the surveyor thereof and that he with the maker be liable of his own and Edward Bailey and Joel Harris keep the said Road in good repair

Ordered that John D. Teller Joel Prince Edmund Bailey and Robt. Paulson or any three of them be let to the lowest undertaker the Repairs or Rebuilding of the bridge across the poplar swamp receive the same when completed and make Report to Court.
