Will George D. Sprague one of the Jurors was withdrawn and the rest of the jury from rendering their verdict discharged. And the cause continued till the next quarterly court for a new trial to be had therein.

This day came the parties by their Attorney and G. D. Sprague to wit William R. Stephenson, George D. Bishop, Sarah Mary, Richard H. Branch, John Sprague, Bennett & Griffie, Thurgut Lane, Samuel Griffie, Will Sumner, Winchur Gray, John Pope, John W. Hunt, David Nicholson, William Whiting, and Parker Story who being elected first and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined returned a verdict in the following words: "to wit" Do the jury find for the plaintiff and assess his damage at forty one dollars and 37/100 with interest thereon from the 12th day of September 1842. Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recovers against the defendant the damage aforesaid as aforesaid and the cost. To be paid of the above and costs of the defendant in the hands of the defendant to be administered.

Ordered that all the acting Justices of the peace for this county be summoned to the first day of the next Term to take into consideration the propriety of allowing George D. Bishop fifty dollars for keeping Thurgut Lane in prison.
