

William F. Mearnsburg Physicians to attend the said hospital and to take such steps as they may deem proper to stop the spreading of said disease as shall seem to them best.

Ordered that S. H. Adams, John Robin & A. B. Wrenshall be appointed Commissioners to let to the lowest bidder the repairs of a small bridge across Terrapin Creek, and receive the same when completed and make report.

Ordered that Kinchon Williams be appointed surveyor of the Road from Williamsboro across the creek to the Super Road in town of C. B. Claus & that the hands of said Kinchon Williams & J. J. Cump with the usual hands do work thereon.

Ordered that Jas. W. Parker, John Cobb, Jonathan Carson, Wm. Dr. Nicholson and Thomas Huddy or any three of them after consulting the same in one of the newspapers published in the City of Norfolk and Town of Petersburg two months successively, and at the door of the Courthouse of this County on some Court day, do let to the lowest undertaker the building of the Jail of this County: to be of the following dimensions: - front 36 feet 6 inches, two story high, 9 feet pitch in each story, 6 feet passage, 9 feet between side & plate windows, constructed as in old jail and said house to be built of brick. The walls of the first story 12 feet thick, that of the second story 12 inches thick. The sills to be heart spruce pine, 6 inches to be white oak, 4 by 6 inches placed within 9 inches of each other; plates 4 by 8 inches; sleepers 10 inches square, placed within 9 inches of each other; joist 4 by 9 inches. all the rooms in house to be ciled on sides & joist with white oak plank 2 inches thick & 9 inches wide nailed on with 5 inches spikes with heads; the floors to be of oak plank 2 inches thick & 9 inches wide nailed with same kind of spikes the door to enter the building to be placed at the end of the passage, and doors to each room. Doors to be of same size and built of same kind of material, and finished as the old jail doors are. The steps to run out of passage to upper story - rafters of usual size; roof covered with sheet plank & tin. Said jail to be built on or near the old site so that the outer wall shall enclose the jail; run & make part of the railing of the public square. The wall to enclose the jail to be distant 10 feet from the jail, to be built as follows: Post to be of post oak, 10 inches square, 8 feet apart, four railing to each panel 4 by 6 inches. Plank to be of heart spruce pine 2 inches thick & 12 inches wide nailed on with 5 inch spikes with heads, with a suitable door for entrance. A brick wall or masonry 10 or 12 inches high to be placed under the wall, so as to protect the plank from the earth, to be 15 feet high including masonry with spikes on top. and the said Commissioners will make sale of the old jail, and the contractors to receive such sum of the Commissioners as will answer to go in the building, which was taken by the Court from Wm. D. Clarke, at a reasonable price to be deducted from the contract - and that the said Commissioners receive the same when completed according to the contract & make report.
