Cobb be called to appear here on the first day of the next Term to show cause if any he can why he should not be attached for his contempt in failing to appear before the said Commissioner in obedience to his summonses.

It is ordered that Alex. Finkler be appointed a Commissioner to receive the new code given by Wm. H. Cobb.

The Commissioners appointed to let the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Bridge over Burns Mill Pond this day made their report.

On the motion of Jm M. Neal who produces the Sheriffs Receipt for the Tax imposed by Law, License is granted him to keep an Ordinary at his house in this County, till the next May Term. It being the opinion of the Court that he is sober and of good character and will probably keep a house orderly, useful and such as the Law requires.

The Court doth assign Zachariah Loyd guardian to Sarah Ann Harris orphan of John Harris dec^d and thereupon he gave bond and security according to Law.

The Court doth assign Joseph S. Prince Guardian of Walter J. Reese & Helen B. Reese orphans of Sampson B. Reese dec^d and thereupon he gave bond and security according to Law.

Power of attorney from Linnea Spivey to Abner McPherson was acknowledged in open Court by said Spivey to be her act and deed.

On reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that the Overseer of the Poor do bind Jas. Chappell of the age of 9 years infant child of Mary Chappell free negro to Wm. H. Summell, and the Court consider that \$5. will be the reasonable annual value of the services of the apprentice in the art, trade or business in which he is to be taught for the first Thirteenth to commence from this day to be paid to his mother, and twenty dollars for the two last years to be paid to the apprentice. And the Overseer of the Poor by whom this order shall be executed in addition to the indentures of apprenticeship shall take from the master bond with satisfactory security in a penalty equal to double the value of the services of the apprentice for the whole term payable and conditions according to Law.
