For William Prince, - James Magget, Wm. A. Jones, Jesse Parker, Ben C. Cove, Wm. L. Maysburg, Jonathan Garden, Saml. D. Brewy, Henry Blum, and James C. Peters - and Benjamin C. Everett and Robert F. Fitch having a majority of the votes were elected. The Court being of opinion that they are men of honesty, probity and good demeanor - and Parker D. Strong and Everett F. Hill were unanimously elected in the lower parish of St. Luke.

Richard St. Branch and Arthur A. Brewy were unanimously elected in upper Nottingham parish.
