

John M. Glover who is sworn on oath by Elizabeth Joyner an unmarried white woman of this County of being the father of two bastard female children whereof she was delivered on the 2nd day of July 1850. This man appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered into at the last term of this Court for his personal appearance here today, and the said Elizabeth Joyner and sundry other witnesses being sworn and examined, and the said Glover by Counsel fully heard, the Court doth adjudge the said John M. Glover to be the father of the said bastard children, and doth order that the said John M. Glover for the maintenance of the said children, pay to the Overseers of the poor of this County, the sum of Twenty dollars each annually from 2nd day of July 1851, until the said children arrive to the age of seven years or they sooner are, and that he also pay the costs of this prosecution, and doth order that the said John M. Glover enter into bond in the penalty of the sum of five hundred dollars with good securities conditioned for the performance of the above order; and the said John M. Glover failing to give said bond he is ordered to jail until such bond be given in Court or filed in the Clerk's office or the said Elizabeth Joyner and the said Overseers of the poor consent to his discharge or he be otherwise legally discharged.
